


Fig. 1: Locating Front Door Components (1 Of 2)

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


Fig. 2: Locating Front Door Components (2 Of 2)




Fig. 3: Locating Rear Door Components (1 Of 2)




Fig. 4: Locating Rear Door Components (2 Of 2)

FRONT DOOR PANEL REMOVAL/INSTALLATION

Special Tools Required: Trim pad remover, Snap-on A 177A or equivalent, commercially available.

- 1. Lower the glass fully.
- 2. Using a flat-tip screwdriver wrapped with protective tape, push on the rear hook (A) and pivot the cover (B) on the front hook (C), then remove the cover and the screw securing the inner handle (D).

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


Fig. 5: Removing The Cover And The Screw Securing The Inner Handle

- 3. Remove the power window switch panel (A).
 - a. Pry up on the rear edge (driver's) or front edge (passenger's) of the switch panel with a flat-tip screwdriver wrapped with protective tape to release the rear clip.
 - b. Pull out along the edge of the panel to release the hooks (B) and front clip.
 - c. Disconnect the power mirror switch connector (C) (driver's) and the power window switch connector (D).





Fig. 6: Removing The Driver's Power Window Switch Panel




Fig. 9: Removing The Grip Cover (Passenger's)




Fig. 10: Removing The Door Panel




Fig. 11: Disconnecting The Inner Handle Cable, Power Door Lock Switch Connector (Passenger's Door), Courtesy Light Bulb Socket & Detaching The Harness Clip

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


Fig. 12: Removing The Door Glass Inner Weatherstrip From The Door Panel




Fig. 13: Removing The Inner Handle




Fig. 14: Removing The Maintenance Hole Seal, Then Disconnecting The Outer Handle Rod




Fig. 15: Pulling The Glass Run Channel Away




Fig. 16: Disconnecting The Cylinder Rod (Driver's Side)

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


Fig. 18: Removing The Bolt Securing The Cylinder Protector, Then Removing The Cylinder Switch, Lock Cylinder & Cylinder Protector As An Assembly (Driver's)




Fig. 19: Removing The Bolt Securing The Cylinder Protector, Then Removing The Cylinder Switch & Cylinder Protector As An Assembly (Passenger's)




Fig. 20: Removing The Key Cylinder Switch (Driver's)




Fig. 21: Separating The Lock Cylinder, Key Cylinder Switch & Key Cylinder Protector (Driver's)




Fig. 22: Removing The Bolt, Then The Spacer




Fig. 23: Removing The Handle From The Holes In The Door Panel






Fig. 25: Disconnecting The Actuator Connectors & Detaching The Inner Handle Cable Clip




Fig. 26: Removing The Latch




Fig. 27: Removing The Lock Cable Protector




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Fig. 28: Removing The Panel Bracket




Fig. 30: Removing The Regulator




Fig. 31: Applying Multipurpose Grease To The Regulator




Fig. 32: Removing The Screw From The Rear Edge Of The Door




Fig. 33: Removing The Weatherstrip






Fig. 35: Removing The Door Weatherstrip




Fig. 36: Removing The Cover And The Screws Securing The Inner Handle





Fig. 37: Removing The Switch Panel




Fig. 39: Removing The Door Panel

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


Fig. 40: Removing The Inner Handle Cable




Fig. 41: Removing The Door Glass Inner Weatherstrip From The Door Panel




Fig. 42: Disconnecting The Outer Handle Rod




Fig. 43: Removing The Screws Securing The Latch




Fig. 44: Removing The Child Lock Cap & Bolt




Fig. 45: Removing The Spacer




Fig. 46: Removing The Handle From The Holes In The Door Panel




Fig. 47: Disconnecting The Outer Handle Rod




Fig. 48: Removing The Screws Securing The Latch



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


Fig. 51: Pulling The Glass Run Channel Out From The Groove Of The Center Lower Channel




Fig. 52: Removing Glass Run Channel





Fig. 53: Removing The Quarter Glass





Fig. 55: Removing The Regulator

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






Fig. 58: Removing Door Outer Molding




Fig. 59: Removing Door Glass Outer Weatherstrip








Fig. 63: Removing The Door Hook Pin From The Door




Fig. 64: Removing The Door Catch From The Body





Fig. 65: Loosening Front Door Glass Mounting Bolts





Fig. 67: Checking That The Glass Contacts The Glass Run Channel Evenly




Fig. 68: Checking For Water Leaks




Fig. 69: Adjusting Front Door Position




Fig. 70: Adjusting Rear Door Position





Fig. 71: Ensuring Door & Body Edges Are Parallel

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


Fig. 73: Locating Interior Trim Components




Fig. 74: Removing & Installing Door Area Trim (Without Side Curtain Airbag)




Fig. 75: Removing & Installing Door Area Trim (With Side Curtain Airbag)




Fig. 76: Removing & Installing Rear Shelf Area Trim (Without Side Curtain Airbag)




Fig. 77: Removing & Installing C-Pillar Area Trim (With Side Curtain Airbag)

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


Fig. 78: Removing & Installing Trunk Area Trim

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


Fig. 79: Removing & Installing Trunk Lid Trim




Fig. 80: Removing The Sunvisor Cap




Fig. 81: Removing The Sunvisor




Fig. 83: Removing The Grab Handles




Fig. 84: Removing The Headliner




Fig. 85: Removing The Grab Handle Brackets

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



Fig. 86: Removing The Roof Side Pads

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



Fig. 88: Pulling Up The Accel Pedal


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Fig. 89: Removing The Footrest




Fig. 91: Removing Connectors & Harnesses (A/T)




Fig. 92: Removing Connectors & Harnesses (M/T)





Fig. 93: Removing The Bolts





Fig. 95: Removing The Shift Knob (M/T)




Fig. 97: Removing The Center Upper Pocket





Fig. 98: Removing The Center Lower Pocket




Fig. 100: Removing The Center Console






Fig. 102: Removing The Center Console Rear Cover






Fig. 105: Removing Driver's Outer Dashboard Trim






Fig. 107: Removing Passenger's Dashboard Lower Cover

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





Fig. 109: Disconnecting The Trunk Lid Opener Main Switch Connector





Fig. 111: Removing Dashboard Side Cover




Fig. 113: Pulling The Top Of The Retainer




Fig. 114: Removing The Glove Box Lock Cylinder




Fig. 115: Installing The Glove Box Lock Cylinder




Fig. 116: Removing Passenger's Dashboard Trim




Fig. 117: Removing Center Vent



- Discharge static electricity from your body before and during the work.

- Do not touch the terminal connector of the flat plate cable with your bare hands. (If you have touched it, wipe it off thoroughly.)

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


Fig. 119: Removing The Center Vent From The Center Panel




Fig. 120: Removing Driver's Side Vent




Fig. 121: Removing Passenger's Side Vent





Fig. 122: Removing The Driver's Center Lower Cover & The Rear Vent Duct




Fig. 124: Disconnecting Driver's Side Under Dash Connectors




Fig. 125: Disconnecting The Dashboard Wire Harness Connectors From The Under-Dash Fuse/Relay Box




Fig. 126: Disconnecting Middle Portion Under Dash Connectors (Shift Lever Portion - A/T)




Fig. 127: Disconnecting Middle Portion Under Dash Connectors (Shift Lever Portion - M/T)




Fig. 128: Disconnecting Middle Portion Under Dash Connectors (Passenger's Side)




Fig. 129: Disconnecting Passenger's Side Under Dash Connectors




Fig. 130: Removing The Brake Pedal Support Member




Fig. 132: Removing The Center Bracket




Fig. 133: Removing The Switch Panel




Fig. 134: Removing The Tweeters




Fig. 135: Detaching The Harness Clips




Fig. 136: Removing The Glove Box Striker




Fig. 137: Disconnecting The Sunlight Sensor Connector





Fig. 138: Detaching The Connectors & Harness Clip On Passenger's Side




Fig. 140: Removing The Screws & Bolts Securing The Dashboard & Steering Hanger Beam




Fig. 141: Removing The Glove Box Striker






Fig. 144: Removing The Front Vent Duct & Side Defogger Vent Trim
