


Fig. 1: Locating Seat Components




Fig. 2: Removing The Seat Track End Covers (Manual Seat)





Fig. 3: Removing The Seat Track End Covers (8-Way Power Seat)




Fig. 5: Detaching The Harness Clip & Disconnecting The Seat Connectors (Manual Seat)




Fig. 6: Detaching The Harness Clip & Disconnecting The Seat Connectors (8-Way Power Seat)




Fig. 7: Exploded View Of Front Seat (Manual)




Fig. 8: Exploded View Of Front Seat (8-Way Power)




Fig. 9: Removing The Recline Motor







Fig. 11: Releasing The Hook Of The Yoke Wire From Top Of The Basket To Loosen The Lumbar Support Cable




Fig. 13: Disconnecting The Lumbar Support Cable From The Lumbar Support Actuator




Fig. 14: Removing The Lumbar Support




Fig. 15: Detaching The Harness Clip & Disconnecting The Seat Connectors (Manual Seat)




Fig. 16: Detaching The Harness Clip & Disconnecting The Seat Connectors (8-Way Power Seat)






Fig. 17: Removing The Clip & The Lumbar Support Handle (8-Way Power Seat)







Fig. 19: Loosening The Seat-Back Cover (Manual Seat)




Fig. 21: Removing The Harnesses (8-Way Power Seat Is Shown; Manual Seat Is Similar)





Fig. 22: Releasing The Front Hook & Rear Hook Of The Reinforcing Cloth From Seat-Back Frame




Fig. 24: Releasing The Clips





Fig. 25: Removing The Seat-Back Cover




Fig. 26: Cover Installation Points




Fig. 27: Releasing The Hook Strips From Both Sides The Seat Cushion (8-Way Power Seat Is Shown)




Fig. 28: Releasing The Clips, Then Pulling Back The Seat Cushion Cover & Releasing The Hooks From Under The Seat Cushion (Manual Seat)




Fig. 29: Releasing The Clips, Then Pulling Back The Seat Cushion Cover & Releasing The Hooks From Under The Seat Cushion (8-Way Power Seat)




Fig. 30: Releasing The Clips From Under The Seat Cushion




Fig. 31: Removing The Seat Cushion Cover




Fig. 32: Seat Cushion Cover Installation Points





Fig. 33: Removing The Rear Seat




Fig. 35: Removing The Seat-Back Lock Cylinder & Cylinder Rods




Fig. 36: Removing The Clip From The Left Portion Of The Armrest Pivot




Fig. 37: Removing The Armrest




Fig. 38: Removing The Beverage Holder








Fig. 41: Releasing The Hooks From The Seat-Back Frame




Fig. 42: Releasing The Hook & Fastener & Unzipping The Seat-Back Cover




Fig. 43: Releasing All The Clips & Folding Back The Left Seat-Back Cover




Fig. 44: Releasing All The Clips & Folding Back The Right Seat-Back Cover




Fig. 45: Removing The Seat-Back Pad & The Headrest Guides





Fig. 46: Removing The Left Seat-Back Cover





Fig. 48: Releasing All The Hook Strips & Folding Back The Seat Side Bolster Cover





Fig. 50: Removing The Seat Cushion Cover




Fig. 52: Locating Power Seat Components




Fig. 53: Power Seat System Wiring Diagram




Fig. 54: Removing Power Seat Switch




Fig. 56: Disconnecting The 12P Connector From The Power Seat Adjustment Switch



4. If the motor does not run or fails to run smoothly, check for an open in the driver's seat wire harness between the 12P connector and each motor connector. If the harness is OK, replace the motor (see **FRONT SEAT RECLINE MOTOR REPLACEMENT**).




Fig. 61: Locating Seat Heater Components





Fig. 62: Seat Heater System Wiring Diagram


Fig. 63: Disconnecting The 4P Connector & 2P Connector From The Seat Heater




